We have two pairs of visitors for the new year. Actually, this pair is going to stay. Sammie and Nellie are the sweetest Bichon Frises.






Later this week we'll get a visit from the loves of my life, my twin daughters, Jamie and Liza, who live on the East Coast.

For a review of 2018 on my save-the-world front, I am so blessed by what amounts to a creative partnership with my assistant, Marina. She had a successful acting career and then went to USC to become a film director. Fortunately, she needed a job along the path to success at that, so for the last almost couple of years she has been filming me. Here are short videos we've done.



Marina is also my social networking maven and does what goes on the internet that's beyond my capacities to deliver, aided by <u>Cameron Cash</u>, an addition to our team this year. (How about that name going along with Nisha Money, an on an off resident here this past year, who recently retired as an air force flight surgeon and is looking to establish a treatment facility in the L.A. area for vets with PTSD.) Cameron is a marketing person (and a yoga instructor), who is steering our SUE Speaks website.

The site was going to focus on creating a Conversation As If Our Lives Depended On It, an interaction among thought leaders about shifting our worldview to where caring about each other would be as important as caring about ourselves. This, to me, is the most vital work – everything that needs fixing will get the best attention if we come at our challenges with a humanitarian point of view instead of being in a competition for having the most money and power. However, we discovered there was no hunger for that dialogue, where all the influential people I know are wrapped up in what they are delivering. Soooo, the conversation idea was dropped in favor of originating projects that could change our worldview.

This will be a webpage for *Making L.A. a Friendlier City*, a model that could be taken up by other cities. This one is with the L.A. City Council now to see if they will get behind it. It's also been offered to West Hollywood – we just would change the name on the model. When I was a facilitator a few months ago for *EmbRACE L.A.*, a big project sponsored by the L.A. City Council which produced dinners all over the city to improve race relations, I saw that the City Council was up for social change projects and fingers crossed they will pick up on this one. If not, you'll get another email from me where we'll launch *Making L.A. a Friendlier City* under the SUE Speaks auspice without city

participation.

Here's how it would work:

Picture yourself in a movie theater. It's early, and you're waiting for the movie to start. You turn to the person next to you and you show them the top part of the site we've made, a la the illustration above, that's on your phone. You tell them you're part of Making L.A. a Friendlier City and you ask if they would have a little conversation with you. When they say yes you ask what movies they've seen lately that they liked a lot and you tell them yours. Then, as the instruction indicates, you ask if they would like to be part of Making L.A. a Friendlier City. If so, they put the website on their device and can follow its instructions about talking to strangers. There's more in the simple instructions about what to talk about in places other than movie theaters and about just what to do to participate.



This is <u>a house event we did</u> that led up to the big project, below, that's in the works now.

This year, I got connected to Conscious Elders Network, now called Elders Action Network, and we sent out this invite to an event in L.A.: "Under the auspice of the Conscious Elders Network, this is an invitation to a salon in West Hollywood for a Conversation As If Our Lives Depended On It, to mine the wisdom gleaned by seniors who are awake to the challenges of our time. In a real engagement where we get to know one another and become comfortable being personal together, the hope is that what would be valuable to the culture at large could emerge."

The Shift-Our-Worldview Coalition Project we're working on...

This is a proposal to the Elders Action Network to be the prime sponsor of this project to create a coalition to shift our worldview:

"A coalition already exists in spirit. It is coming together now in the social context by the attraction of its unconventional intelligence and compassionate form of high-mindedness. This natural coalition is drawn together by the recognition that the elevation of consciousness is our fundamental life work. This is a genuinely democratic, self-organizing force, flowing through persons of all descriptions. This force does not flourish as any highly structured form. It is not an institution or a foundation or a non-profit company or anything conventionally named. This coalition is a living organism -natural, wild, free. It is made up of individuals devoted to serving the world and developing themselves as finely tuned instruments of service. They learn to gather in the energy of will-to-good, from which authentic goodwill flows out subtly to the entire world." – Lex Hixon

Twenty years ago, I gave Lex Hixon a platform where he wasn't serving followers in any of

the five spiritual disciplines he practiced but he could act as <u>the rabble-rousing avatar he was</u>. What he wrote, above, was the basis for enrolling a coalition that we saw beinglarge enough to shift our paradigm. The Shift-Our-Worldview Coalition Project would pick up where that intention left off.

Given there are scenarios where human life would be annihilated, it behooves people who are aware of the threat to us to think boldly. Humanity has to work together to deal with the forces of nature and the effects of human greed that are so dangerous to us. Since governments resist what threatens power structures, any impetus to change our worldview won't come from Washington and this proposal looks to the people for that.

While vast in scope, the Coalition Project is actually pretty simple. With initiation and oversight from the Elders Action Network, it would issue a statement that expresses what Lex wrote describing a perspective where caring is ascendant and asking people who feel aligned with it to become signatory to it. We would enroll many organizations as cosponsors who would spread the word. Via Mighty Companions, I could deliver whatever nuts and bolts it would take to get a document for signatures, to produce a website and the needed technology, to acquire that broad co-sponsorship, and to provide whatever support it would take to run projects that this force would take on.

There is nothing operative now that has a serious possibility of being transformative to the human condition. If this project were handled well, don't you think many millions of people would participate? It could do what OCCUPY aspired to accomplish. There was no way OCCUPY could harness the power of those millions who took to the streets, where we would have everyone under one umbrella for whatever actions we would come up with for this force to take.

The master plan we were working on when Lex got sick was to have Celebrations of the Human Spirit in stadiums, with that paragraph of his as the draw to who would come. A Celebration of the Human Spirit in a large theater that we would livestream to the world could be the first action for this coalition to take.

Here's <u>a little addendum I came across</u> that reminds us of the heritage that our materialistic world has lost sight of. The mutuality evoked by the Coalition Project would be a return to our birth as a one-life:

Living tools by which tribes and ancient cultures have sustained human growth on Earth:

All My Relations from the Native American tradition.

The Practice: To discover, name, and repair the connections that exist between all things.

Ubuntu from the African tradition.

The Practice: To water the common roots by which we all grow and to honor our strong need to join.

Thou Art That from the Hindu tradition.

The Practice: To face and feel a life of compassion that honors that we are at heart the same.

The I and Thou Relationship from the Jewish tradition.

The Practice: To stay committed to the life of honest conversation.

Ya Ayuni! from the Lebanese tradition.

The Practice: To welcome other views in the belief that we need each other to be complete.

The Great Spoked Wheel from the early Christian mystic tradition.

The Practice: To embody the paradox of our uniqueness and commonness by which the Great Wheel of Humanity turns **Hygge** from the Danish tradition. The Practice: To create well-being, connection, warmth, and a sense of belonging.

I See You! I Am Here! from the African Bushmen tradition.

The Practice: To be present and bear witness to each other and other life.

As these projects have been developing, we delivered some Salon events at home base and are about to launch <u>a podcast</u>, <u>SEARCHING FOR UNITY IN EVERYTHING</u>: <u>MEANINGFUL CONVERSATIONS WITH MEANINGFUL PEOPLE</u>, with people who house-guested with me as the guests for the first two.



We are doing the paperwork that will give me the rights to Suzanne, the Leonard Cohen song that is the intro and the outro for our podcasts. When that's accomplished we'll post Mary Reed, "an accidental mystic," and Ramana, whose Radical Awakening work promises "you never will have to take another workshop to find yourself again."
