What is a *Pip Watch*, you ask? It's looking for cracks in the eggs. That's what starts the hatching process.

Jackie and Shadow's 2nd clutch is here! What is a *2nd clutch*, you ask? They lost their first clutch this season – i.e. their first two eggs -- and now we have the second two, laid on February 8th and February 11th. March 15th would be the first day the first egg might start to crack.



From 8:00 am to 10:00 pm pacific, people are talking to each other, commenting on what they are watching, becoming like family. I keep a window open on it when I'm at my computer. Whenever something "dramatic" happens, like a shift-change for egg-sitting or a predator comes close, that becomes a little video you can watch if you missed the live event. It is beyond sweet. There can be 2,000 people watching at the same time. I just was watching when the eggs were left un-sat upon for a long enough time during a shift-change that people were in a dander about danger the eggs could be in.
